ROANOKE, Va. — Charleston art photographer Deborah Herndon's original metallic photographs "Link's Tripod & Mid-Mod" and "Arrivals and Departures by Train" were chosen by the O. Winston Link Museum of Photography to celebrate its 10th anniversary Jan. 25.

Herndon also designed an anniversary remembrance card for the museum that included back stories concerning the photographs shot onsite at the museum. The museum is in a former terminal of mid-century modern design and houses artworks of iconic railway and rural life by photographer O. Winston Link and others.

"I used O. Winston Link's original tripod in the shot for the cover of the commemorative card as a tribute to his incredible artistic spirit," Herndon said. Norfolk & Western Railway was organized in 1881 and headquartered in Roanoke, VA. Originally, N & W carried agriculture products to ports east and west, but later became coal's chief transport to market. The passenger trains were added later to serve customers in its "mid-century modern" styled Roanoke terminal.

 In 2004, the former N & W passenger terminal was repurposed as a museum to commemorate O. Winston Link, an icon of B/W steam locomotive and rural life photography. Mr. Link's original tripod and the entry "mid-century modern" original bench are featured in the photograph rendered graphic.
