

Metallic photography exhibit to open Oct. 1

“Metallic Photographs — Doors and Details of Chicago, Spain and France,” a show by art photographer Deborah Herndon, will open Oct. 1 at Citywoods, 651 Central Ave., Highland Park.

The effects of the metallic process combined with the unique architectural details of buildings from Chicago, Spain and France make for a show of special pieces to view or purchase.

The “limited edition” art works comparing architectural details across the Atlantic will open with an artist reception from 1-5 p.m. Oct. 1 and continue through Dec. 31.

“Architectural details reflect the cultural heritage and artistic core of Chicago, southern France and Barcelona,” explains Herndon. “The similarities in architectural design and materials shows how connected these well-known architects were, even in the late 1800s.”

Herndon adds, “the metallic print process I use emboldens color and depth of field of these art works to further capture the mind’s eye.”

Herndon holds a master’s degree from the College of Architecture of Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Va.

She has juried into Artisan Centers in several states, participated in numerous juried national, regional and solo exhibits, and shows her work in 22 galleries in six states.
